Treasurer's Report – Current balance is \$4,512.25. This balance reflects expenses and receipts from the Immunization Update and Grand Rounds.

General Membership Meeting Site Change - In 2012, DCIC general membership meetings will be held at the Madison Water Utility building located at 119 E. Olin Avenue. The State Medical Society notified the Coalition that it would no longer be able to offer the site for our meetings free of charge, hence the need for a change of venue. DCIC would like to thank the State Medical Society for providing a beautiful meeting space over the past several years.

Immunization Symposium and Grand Rounds – This year's immunization update held at the American Family Insurance Conference Center in October, featuring nurse practitioner, Patsy Stinchfield, and Dr. James Conway was once again a phenomenal success with nearly 300 people in attendance. Grand Rounds presentations featured former DCIC Board member, Dr. Tom Saari discussing adolescent vaccines. This year, both presentations were recorded and can be viewed at the DCIC website.

How to Collect Meaningful Immunization Data for your Organization - Elaine Rosenblatt of Unity Health Plan led off the presentations by several area organizations with information regarding HEDIS and NCQA. Lisa Sherven of Group Health Cooperative of South Central Wisconsin (GHSCSW) subsequently presented information on how GHSCSW collects immunization data and outreaches members. Sandy Jacobson followed with data collection and outreach information from the UW Health's perspective. Both organizations currently use electronic data sources, both internal records along with the Wisconsin Immunization Registry to assemble immunization status information needed to perform outreach to their members/patients. Freddi Adelson of the Madison Metropolitan School District rounded out the group of presenters with information on school immunization and waiver data and their efforts to improve immunization rates.
