



General Membership meeting

Tuesday August 15, 2017

1. DCIC Treasurer Report--\$23,758.52
2. Updates:
 - a. State Immunization Program HPV grant- some funds went to school clinics for printing and food for volunteers and students/families, looking for opportunities to show "Someone you Love" HPV movie, only have a few hundred dollars left to use by October 31.
 - b. School clinics- held at Marshall schools on July 26 and 27, 2017
 - i. 100 kindergarten and 6th graders screened for immunizations and vaccines recommended
 - ii. 261 7-12th graders screened for immunizations and vaccines recommended
 - iii. For a grand total of 361 students and their parents informed of their immunization status, with those needing vaccines recommended to follow up with their medical provider soon to be immunized
 - iv. 53 students were immunized in all, with 21 doses of HPV given, 8 doses of Tdap, 23 doses of meningococcal vaccine, 32 doses of hepatitis A vac
 - v. At least 2 students who previously had waivers were immunized and no longer needed the waiver in the future
 - vi. 28 student immunization records were updated in WIR as we received permission from families to enter the student immunization record into WIR. School does not routinely enter new records into WIR.
 - c. Adult Grant summary- Completed in June, most funds went to Immunization symposium this past April, remainder of funds went to editing the adult immunization talk from the spring immunization symposium for CEUs during the next 2 years for pharmacists, physicians and nurses.
 - d. Dental outreach- Gwen is doing a few lunch and learns with dental health associates about HPV and link to oral cancer, helped dental providers on how to discuss importance of vaccination in their oral health checks
 - e. VFC thermometer requirements- by 1/1/18, all VFC providers Link to memo from DHS on requirements <https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/immunization/vfc-data-logger-memo.pdf>
 - i. UW has Primex, GHC is looking at Primex and Senso Scientific, Public Health has Senso Scientific
3. What's New with Flu? Updates from manufacturers on flu vaccine products and shipping/availability
 - a. Alan Barker, GSK- FluLaval quad and Fluarix Quad,
 - i. Flulaval Quad has a new expanded age indication of 6 months and up using dose of 0.5ml (same dose for all ages in either multidose vials or pre-filled syringes). See link below for educational videos on use.

 - iii. Supply-have 2 manufacturing locations, to assure supply
 - iv. Private purchase is guaranteed complete delivery by end of Dec with similar
 - v. On track today to deliver 50% by end of August and remainder by end of Oct and similar for VFC orders
 - b. Wes Spitznagle, Sanofi- Fluzone comes in 0.25, 0.5 and high dose vaccine
 - i. Supply- manufacturing and shipping is going as planned, can check on dose status in vaccineshoppe.com
 - ii. VFC and private are shipped to equally
 - iii. Only presentation not available are the multidose vials. All other presentations are available
 - iv. Flu campaign material available that is non-branded and called Fluency
 - v. Tenivac is now available again
 - c. Allison Wright, Seqirus- Vaccine line came from Novartis-
 - i. Fluvad- for over age 65 Trivalent vaccine approved in 2015 in the U.S,
 - ii. Flucelvax- quad vaccine for ages 4 years and up
 - iii. Afluria - trivalent and quadrivalent- trivalent is ages 5 and up, Quad ages 18 and up
 - iv. Fluvax- age 5 and up
 - v. Fluvarin- age 4 and up
 - vi. RapiVab Anti-viral
4. Discussion with members on initiatives/outreach to increase influenza vaccination of members and/or staff in their Organizations
- a. UHS- involved in a campaign with a flu foundation, will do different flu clinics around campus, Will also provide HPV vaccine at flu clinics with a focus on international students insured with SHIP campus insurance.
 - b. GHC- trying to take care of flu vaccine for patients on same day when they are in clinic, worked to identify a person at each clinic that can help meet the same day demand and sending out daily information at each clinic, also posters and buttons to help keep it in the front of staff and patient awareness, also have planned flu clinics and will be mailing messages to patients to schedule in the flu clinics
 - c. UW- try to assess for other vaccines as well when time allows at flu clinics, UW pharmacy will also give flu vaccine for 6 years and older. Some other vaccines also available at pharmacies, some with extended hours.
 - d. PHMDC- use VFC for kids and offer vax at every visit, ordered 650 doses of private purchase to allow vaccination of adults without insurances. Partner with Medic to allow nursing students and pharmacy students to vaccinate at homeless shelters, Saturday Medic clinic, Veterans Stand Down event.
 - e. Other efforts: Handing out Flu and other vaccination flyers at different walk/run events throughout Dane county
