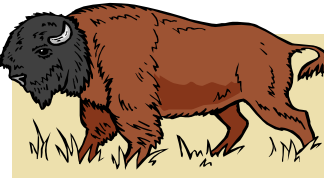


Farmers' Market: Captive Game Animals or Birds

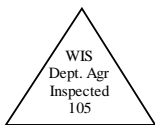


What are Captive Game Animals or Birds?

Bison, white-tail deer, pheasants, quail, wild turkeys, migratory wildfowl, and exotic birds

Licensing

- All meat/poultry must be inspected and passed at a Wisconsin or federally inspected facility.
- A current Dane County Farmers' Market Vendor license or DATCP Mobile Retail license is required at the Farmers' Market (no copies).
- *If only selling in Dane County, a Dane County Farmers' Market Vendor license is required. If selling in multiple counties, only a DATCP Mobile Retail license is required. Operating simultaneously at multiple markets requires a license for each location.*



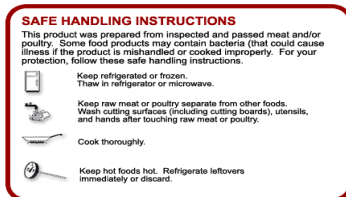
Game Animals

Storage/Display

- Store foods a minimum of 6 inches off the ground
- Provide a canopy or overhead protection
- Protect foods from customer contamination
- Transport foods in clean equipment and vehicles
- Maintain frozen at all times

Sampling

- Must be protected from consumer contamination with lids/covers
- Provide a safe method for customers to sample products
- Post a sign or provide verbal sampling instructions
- Cooking, cutting samples or any other processing activities onsite is not acceptable without a Temporary Restaurant Permit
- Displayed foods (foods not for sale) must have a sign stating "Display Only"
