

## **General Membership meeting**

## Tuesday November 19, 2019

- 1. Treasurer report- Current balance \$23,862.46, payment for todays lunch pending
- 2. Announcements—Hillary Plumb has joined the DCIC Board, from HyVee Pharmacy, completing the Board positions filled. Spring Symposium is scheduled for 4/21/20. 3 other coalitions in the state have also coordinated requests for CDC speaker that week.
- **3. Updates** (Please let us know if you have topics you would like to see covered at a membership meeting)
  - a. Public Health-Madison and Dane County (Sarah) Community clinics in collaboration with HyVee have been held at community schools again and finished last week. PHMDC clinics met the needs of school immunization demands. Again doing farm clinics at 5 dairy farms to adult workers, many who are immigrants without access to care. Free flu vaccine continues at PHMDC clinics for uninsured.
  - b. DCIC Membership meetings for 2020 are on 2/18, 5/19, 8/18 and 11/17. Madison Water Utility reserved for these meetings but are considering other locations also. To be discussed by DCIC Board and any changes will be announced.
- 4. Wisconsin Health Disparities Report, by Wisconsin Collaborative for Health Care Quality with Abby Harburn and Lauren Bednarz, analysts. See attached slides and handout
  - i. Purpose of the report is to gain information. No solutions addressed at this time but the data may guide potential solutions
  - ii. Report only measures those patients seen twice or more in the past 2 years at providers. Does not measure or address those not seen for care.
  - iii. Data only from health systems, not health plans
  - iv. Significant disparities between different systems. Each system has received their own report. They are encouraged to share publicly.
  - v. Reports were distributed to organizations administration and QI staff. They are encouraged to use report in their communities and make available to the public. Report results will be updated twice a year.
  - vi. FQHC's were not included in the data due to additional requirements need in federal reports.
  - vii. WCHQ in transition with IT system. In process to get more detailed information in the future, especially for children.
  - viii. Discussion
    - 1. Disparities evident, though differ between some vaccines, insurance status. Uninsured with lowest rates of immunizations.
    - 2. Need to address systemic racism as root cause of disparity results identified brought up multiple times
    - 3. Need to bring stakeholders to table and not reinvent the wheel, or waste efforts already in process with parallel efforts.
    - 4. Does not address/measure missed opportunities.
