- DCIC Treasurer Report: \$20,029.99; no grant money left to spend down (~\$8,000 payments incoming); some upcoming expenses for lunch and learns with oral health providers
- Updates: Adult grant-summary, dental outreach in progress
 - O Grant:
 - Inservices to dental providers re: HPV; lunches provided
 - received \$8,000 from State for Adult Outreach (used most of the funds for Imms Symposium)
 - discussing talking tips for oral health providers, providing brochures to parents, borrow slideset from dentist who presented at National Confernece.
 - Lunch and learns going well (done 5 already and have 10 more scheduled)
 - Focusing on: bringing up HPV when discussing oral cancer screening, adding HPV vaccination to medical screening form and checking for oral cancer (if not already doing so)
 - Over 800 oral health providers emailed; 771 received the email; 440 opened the email; 1st Choice Dental is providing lunch and learns to all facilities
 - Not much is being done nationwide re: oral health provider outreach

Product efficacy data: 1 dose, interval variance: Wanda Conley (GSK Medical Science Liason)

Use and discuss supply, strategies for distribution

- Flu Updates
 - Sanofi Pasteur (Ashley)
 - >10% flu doses shipped
 - 1/3 pre-booked will be shipped by end of August
 - All flu options available for order
 - Express Order is an option-order now and receive within 2 business days
 - MedImmune (Tracey)
 - FluMist back on the market
 - Wait list for pre-book
 - CDC opened up additional VFC pre-booking; WI did not participate
 - Issues with flumist stemmed from replicated fitness of the H1N1 strain
 - Has a good match with this year's strain
 - Never lost FDA support (only ACIP recommendation)
 - Looking at September and October shipping dates
 - Since it is a live virus vaccine, there is an 18 week expiration date
 - Can return unused vaccine
 - Extra studies have been done and will be done for new strains
 - Can be given 2-49 y.o.
 - Don't need to sniff up/snort up nose; give hard push for mist; if don't push hard, get dribble-that's okay. Main point is that vaccine needs to touch mucosal membranes
 - Talking points for parents: VIS and other resources available
 - FluMist makes up about 12-15% of the flu vaccine market
 - 1.3 million private market; 700,000 VFC doses this year
 - Segirus (Allison)
 - FluAd-adjuvanted, trivalent vaccine for older adults (>65yo)
 - Presentation re: FluAd
 - Includes strains A and B
 - Egg and GBS=contraindications
 - Common to see more redness and tenderness with adjuvanted vaccine over non-adjuvanted vaccine (traditional trivalent)
 - Persistence of seroconversion 12 months after vaccination
 - 25%+ decrease in hospitalization rates in one Italian study of older adults
 - Licensed in Europe and given preferential recommendation in UK
 - Working on quadrivalent formulation for 2019 flu season
 - Approved in 2015 in US
 - Cost is cheaper than hi dose flu & covered by Medicare
 - o GSK (Alan)
 - Fluarix and Flulaval (quadrivalent; 0.5 mL for >6 months)
 - 100% vaccine will be shipped by end of September
 - FluLaval and Fluarix-over 5 million doses shipped
 - 100% of multi-dose vials will be shipped by August 31
- How to improve flu vaccine uptake with clients/members?
 - Universal standing orders
 - o Nurse only visits

- After hours appointments
 - Meriter: After Hours (Sat/Sun-walk-ins); can get immunized for anything
 - Dean: Evening and Saturday morning appts; very busy and booked through September
 - Assoicated Physicians: has evening hours

Most organizations with very limited supplies of FluMist this year, some not carrying it this year due to VFC coverage issues

Shingrix

Alan Barker, supply issues

- --shipments every 2 weeks in limited doses. Significant increase in number of doses, shipping
- --limited quantities through 2018 into 2019
- --GSK has stopped advertising the product until supplies increase, focus on education

Wanda Conley, Medical Science Liason, GSK

- --provided limited data on small studies available regarding one dose protection and dose intervals greater than the recommended 2-6 months.
- --CDC has clinical guidance available online. Please share and reinforce with providers/patients https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/vpd/shingles/hcp/shingrix/faqs.html
- --encourage timely administration of both doses whenever possible
- --see attached documents with study results
- --next year will have 10 year data on efficacy/immunity, then evaluate for any need for booster
