What is Prenatal Care Coordination (PNCC)?

Prenatal Care Coordination is a part of Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus that provides **free** support and services during your pregnancy.

How does the program work?

- A public health nurse meets with you during your pregnancy and until your baby is 2 months old.
- Your PNCC nurse will help guide you, but you make the decisions on how to care for **yourself** and **your baby**.
- Your PNCC nurse and health care provider can work together as a team.

What can PNCC do for me?

- Provide personal support to set goals and reach them.
- Offer help getting health care.
- Help you prepare for your new baby.
- Give information on health topics like: eating habits, child development, safe sleep, staying active, breastfeeding and more!
