DCIC Treasurer Report, member updates:

- Treasurer reports \$23,801.31
 - includes adult immunization grant received

Announcements:

- **Spring Symposium**-April 25, 2018 at American Family; JoEllen Wolicki will be the CDC speaker along with having a panel discussion afterwards. Registration is free and an email will be coming out soon; CEUs will be available for MAs
- **Adult Immunization Grant:** will focus more on improving behaviors and educating practitioners and healthcare providers
 - 3 goals:
 1. increase adult immunization knowledge and awareness of providers (will accomplish by having speaker JoEllen Wolicki at spring symposium)
 2. increase HPV prevention knowledge for dental healthcare providers (will accomplish through lunch and learns in urban and rural Dane County)
 3. increase knowledge of adult immunizations for healthcare providers (will accomplish through lunch and learns at clinics)
 - objectives for lunch and learns—increase adult immunization rates in Dane County by improving provider understanding of current recommended adult immunizations, address questions and concerns of how and who to recommend vaccines for.

Wisconsin Collaborative For Healthcare Quality (WCHQ)-Jill Lindwall

- Gave background as to how WC 82 formed – different healthcare systems across the state participate
- WCJ two represents over 65% of practicing providers in Wisconsin
- Mission is to be transparent and public daily report data
- WCHQ works with each organization's quality team to collect and validate data
- AMA, RWJ foundation etc. assembly meetings to share national perspectives, local perspectives
- All patients, all payers
- Systems can run their own reports from WCJ too
- Measurement Advisory Committee (MAC) meets monthly to look at current measures, discuss new measures, etc.
- Specific immunization measures exist-, patient must be seen in the last 24 to 36 months; patient medical home to be included in data/reporting
- WCHQ supports members in their transition to value-based care
- Goal is to bring organizations together to learn and share to improve quality of care
- Groups create tools and resources
- Jill will follow up on their measurement development as it relates to HEDIS
- WCHQ will partner with public health but does not report their data
- Each measure has exclusion criteria, numerator definitions consistent with HEDIS
- Data looks active patients
- Systems work to engage in active patients

SSM health – Kim Volberg

- Dean works with 40 different payers
- All payers focus on HEDIS
- Provider metric spotlight reports – monthly provider report cards
 - focus on 4 measures per year, changes every year

- Quality Improvement Pod – works to close gaps in care- prints list daily – telephone, letter in my chart follow-up
- Uses Lean 6 Sigma approach for performance improvement
 - HPV vaccine improvement project
 - patients getting child started, not finishing series
 - parents get calls to remind to get child in for second vaccine
- Discussion around how SSM and WCHQ to addresses disparities

UW-Elaine

- Internal benchmarking-- dashboard that is visible to all
- WCHQ offers external benchmarking-
 - quality improvement prioritization- helps focus on certain areas
 - quality incentive programs – compensation for providers
